COORDINATING SYSTEMS AROUND PHYSICAL LITERACY

An RBC Innovations Project

| SUMMARY REPORT |

Overview

Coordinating Systems Around Physical Literacy was designed to enhance the coordination of three Calgary and area RBC Learn to Play projects towards systemswide educational approaches, while documenting and sharing the processes that are required to do so in multiple contexts.

This initiative built upon previous work piloting systems change strategies in four boards (RBC Innovations project 2015-16), extending the impacts by coordinating multiple projects and mobilizing the knowledge.

The knowledge gained from this initiative was translated into a planning tool to support systems change titled *Pathways to Physical Literacy - Choose Your Own Adventure*.

4 meetings were held to advance coordination and collaboration between school boards and promote systems level changes. All 3 boards had representation from multiple stakeholders, including teachers and school jurisdiction staff.

Activities & Results



Pathways to physical literacy were documented, revealing 5 similar but distinct processes by which schools advance physical literacy, as well as the conditions which influence their pathways.



A resource was developed to share learnings of the pathways and facilitate planning and decision-making when undertaking physical literacy work in school.

Meetings

A total of two coordination meetings and an additional two collaboration meetings were organized. At these meetings school and district staff had the opportunity to share their successes and barriers/facilitators, discuss how they could be better supported by their districts and what system supports they needed, and map out their physical literacy journeys. These meetings were attended by teachers, administrators and district staff.

Professional Learning

Professional learning was offered throughout the project to enhance buy in and increase knowledge and awareness. We hosted Dr. Dean Kreillars and supported project participants to attend the Live Active Summit in Edmonton.

Documenting Pathways

School and district level pathways were documented throughout the two coordination meetings.

At the first collaboration meeting schools and districts were given the opportunity to map out their pathways and share with others. This fed directly into the development of the planning tool.

The Process

The tool was created through a three step process:

- 1 Pathway Transcription The individual pathways from the first collaboration meeting were transcribed.
 - Pathway Coding Steps, facilitators and barriers in each pathway were coded using common language.

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Pathway Mapping

The pathways were mapped into 5 possible pathways to physical literacy.

The Planning Tool

The Tool

The tool was created using Prezi NEXT, an online presentation tool. This tool allows individuals to see the various pathways that were observed in the three Calgary area jurisdictions. They can start the pathway from the beginning or find themselves along the pathway and see potential next steps. By clicking on each step they can see a description of the step and it's significance to the pathway, as well as potential resources that may help them move forward.



The tool was showcased at the RBC Innovations Webinar and prototyped in the second collaboration meeting with representatives from the Calgary area jurisdictions.



Key Learnings

Each pathway went through the following two cycles:

1st Tier Learning

Building a team of school champions, developing their skills, gathering and using available resources, and gaining the buy-in from key school staff, administrators and/or parents.

2nd Tier Learning

A sustainable process of schoolwide capacity building, where more experienced members of the school community continue to develop their practice through mentoring others, through gathering and use of resources and developing skills.
